

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

The Continuation of the Kingdom

The NT and Historical Optimism The Biblical Hope: Part VI Matthew 13:18-33; 28:18-20 Stuart W. Bryan

I. The Growing Kingdom (Dan 2:34-36, 44; 7:13-14)

¹³ "I was watching in the night visions, And behold, One like the Son of Man, Coming with the clouds of heaven! He came to the Ancient of Days, And they brought Him near before Him. ¹⁴ Then to Him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom, That all peoples, nations, and languages should serve Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion, Which shall not pass away, And His kingdom the one Which shall not be destroyed. (Dan 7:13-14)

Daniel sees a vision of Jesus' ______ not His Second Coming. And when Jesus ascends to the Father, what happens? *To Him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom in order that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve Him.*

II. The Great Commission (Mt 28:18-20 cf. Mk 3:23-27; Rev 20:1-3)

¹⁸ And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen. (Mt 28:18-20)

Jesus articulates what Daniel saw. Because Jesus has been given all authority in heaven and earth, He commissions the disciples to *go and make disciples of ______ the nations*. The nations are His inheritance (cf. Ps 2:8) and so now He is sending the disciples to claim them.

III. Parables of the Kingdom

When Jesus speaks of the Kingdom of Heaven, He is announcing the arrival of the reign of God on earth through His Messiah. The kingdom parables describe the nature of His rule.

A. Organic not Cataclysmic (13:18-23 cf. Mk 4:26-29)

¹⁸Therefore hear the parable of the sower: ¹⁹When anyone hears the word of the kingdom, and does not understand it, then the wicked one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart. This is he who received seed by the wayside. ²⁰But he who received the seed on stony places, this is he who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; ²¹yet he has no root in himself, but endures only for a while. For when tribulation or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he stumbles. ²²Now he who received seed among the thorns is he who hears the word, and the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and he becomes unfruitful. ²³But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and produces: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty.

The parable of the sower emphasizes the *organic* nature of the kingdom. The kingdom comes by *persuasive preaching* not *militaristic conquest*.

B. Realistic not Utopian (13:24-30)

²⁴ Another parable He put forth to them, saying: "The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field; ²⁵ but while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat and went his way. ²⁶ But when the grain had sprouted and produced a crop, then the tares also appeared. ²⁷ So the servants of the owner came and said to him, 'Sir, did you not sow good seed in your field? How then does it have tares?' ²⁸ He said to them, 'An enemy has done this.' The servants said to him, 'Do you want us then to go and gather them up?' ²⁹ But he said, 'No, lest while you gather up the tares you also uproot the wheat with them. ³⁰ Let both grow together until the harvest, and at the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, "First gather together the tares and bind them in bundles to burn them, but gather the wheat into my barn.""

The kingdom of God will be a *wheat field*. However, there will remain ______ among the wheat – the devil remains active. Jesus' kingdom is *realistic* not *utopian*.

C. Vast not Miniscule (13:31-32 cf. Dan 4:10-12; Mk 4:30-32)

³¹ Another parable He put forth to them, saying: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and sowed in his field, ³² which indeed is the least of all the seeds; but when it is grown it is greater than the herbs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and nest in its branches."

Though Jesus' kingdom starts really tiny, eventually it grows to be a massive tree under which the birds of the air (the ______ of the earth) will take refuge.

D. Living not Lifeless (13:33)

³³ Another parable He spoke to them: "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven, which a woman took and hid in three measures of meal till it was all leavened."

Jesus' kingdom is not like a *lifeless* substance that remains where you put it; it is living and active like leaven; it works *organically* to permeate the world.

IV. Application

A. Progress vs. Rule

The Scriptures do not teach *progress per se* but *the personal rule of Jesus*. Jesus reigns. Jesus is Lord. He blesses those who respond to His Word in faith and ultimately judges those who rebel against His lawful rule.

B. Newspaper Exegesis

Newspaper exegesis presumes that we are able to understand exactly what Jesus is up to at every point in history. But this is folly. As our Great King, Jesus knows precisely what He is doing; but we won't always know in detail. But we do know that Jesus loves the world too much to permit the nations to reject Him indefinitely.

C. Generational Faith

What this means, therefore, is that the work we are doing now is laying the foundation, good or ill, for the future of the Kingdom of God. Our calling as the people of God is to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world – to work in faith trusting Christ to spread His kingdom by Word and Spirit.

V. Conclusion (John 12:31-32)

³¹ "Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be cast out. ³² And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw ______ to Myself." (Jn 12:31-32)


