# Easter 2021 - The Glory of Reigning with Christ

Colossians 3:1-17 Stuart W. Bryan

## **I. Reigning with Christ** (cf. Rev 1:5-6; 2:26-27; 3:21; 5:9-10)

Easter is the beginning of Jesus' rule as King. One of the remarkable promises of Scripture is that Jesus will share this rule with us. He wants us to reflect the glory of His kingly authority.

- 5... To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood, <sup>6</sup>and <u>has made us</u> kings and priests to His God and Father, to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. (1:5b-6)
- 26And he who overcomes, and keeps My works until the end, to him <u>I will give power</u> over the nations— 27'He shall rule them with a rod of iron; They shall be dashed to pieces like the potter's vessels'— as I also have received from My Father... (2:26-27) <sup>21</sup>To him who overcomes <u>I will grant</u> to sit with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on His throne. (3:21)
- <sup>9</sup>And [the four living creatures] sang a new song, saying: "You are worthy to take the scroll, And to open its seals;
   For You... <u>have made</u> [your people] kings and priests to our God; And [they] shall reign on the earth." (5:9-10)

### II. Resurrection Glory in the Here and Now

Christ a	assures us that we shall share His kingly glory — both in the future and in the present: <sup>11</sup> But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you. <sup>12</sup> Therefore, brethren, we are debtors—not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. <sup>13</sup> For if you live according to the flesh you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. <sup>14</sup> For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God.
The Sp	resurrection and empowers us to live righteously in the Paul fleshes this out in Colossians 3:  If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. <sup>2</sup> Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth. <sup>3</sup> For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. <sup>4</sup> When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory.

But note that this has ramifications in the By the Spirit, in otism, we died to sin and were raised to new life with Christ. As Paul writes in Romans 6:  1 What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? 2 Certainly not! How shall we who died to
	sin live any longer in it? <sup>3</sup> Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? <sup>4</sup> Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.

is to sin	s it to be earthly-minded? To be earthly-minded is to live a life of sexual perversion, malice, and deceit; it and, thus, to mar and deface the image of God. To be earthly-minded is to imitate the old man in rather than to reflect the new man in To be earthly-minded is to be a practical
atheist;	to live as though there is no heaven. It is to walk in darkness, in ignorance, and in rebellion.

#### A. Sexual Sins (5-7 cf. Prov 5; Heb 13:4; 1 Thes 4:1-8)

<sup>5</sup>Therefore put to death your members which are on the earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. <sup>6</sup>Because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience, <sup>7</sup>in which you yourselves once walked when you lived in them.

Notice that to put to death our members which are on the earth is to flee sexual sin. To be heavenly-minded rather than earthly-minded is to pursue sexual glory. We are to set our minds on things above by putting to death sexual sin. As Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 6:13-20:

<sup>13</sup>...Now the body is not for sexual immorality but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. <sup>14</sup>And God both raised up the Lord and will also raise us up by His power. <sup>15</sup>Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a harlot? Certainly not! <sup>16</sup>Or do you not know that he who is joined to a harlot is one body with her? For "the two," He says, "shall become one flesh." <sup>17</sup>But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with Him. <sup>18</sup>Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body. <sup>19</sup>Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? <sup>20</sup>For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.

#### B. Interpersonal Sins (8-11)

When Adam and Eve rebelled against God, their earthly-mindedness not only manifested itself in sexual brokenness but in relational brokenness:

<sup>8</sup>But now you yourselves are to <u>put off</u> all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. <sup>9</sup>Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds, <sup>10</sup>and have put on the new man who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him, <sup>11</sup>where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave nor free, but Christ is all and in all.

As those who have been raised with Christ, we are to shun such earthly-mindedness and to put on heavenly-mindedness. So what does heavenly-mindedness look like?

<sup>12</sup>Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, <u>put on</u> tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; <sup>13</sup>bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. <sup>14</sup>But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection. <sup>15</sup>And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful. <sup>16</sup>Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. <sup>17</sup>And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.

# IV. Reflecting the Glory of Christ's Rule

One of the ways that we reflect the glory of Christ's kingly rule in the \_\_\_\_\_\_ is by ruling ourselves. We reflect the glory of Christ's rule by putting off sexual and interpersonal sins and devoting our lives to the service of God and neighbor. Christ has risen from the dead to free you from *earthly-mindedness* so that you might be *heavenly-minded*.
